What is this competition all about?



We invite Youth around the world to take part in the 2026 UNESCO Worldwide Multimedia Competition. Think creatively, use their talents and share their voice.

By the year 2030, the Sustainable Development Goals aim to create a world free of poverty, inequality, and injustice where people and the planet thrive together.

1. Pick one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals.
2. Pick a project area, Robotic/AI, Local Project or Storytelling & Musical Arts.
3. Through your creativity, project or activism show us your vision.

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Our Goals

- Encourage young minds to think about important issues facing our world today.
- Inspire youth to answer the question using their talents, creative thinking and problem solving skills.
- Bridge generations in the ideas, development and implementation of positive change.
- To facilitate collaboration and teamwork with project development and implementation.
- To strengthen the mission and goals of UNESCO including peace and international goodwill.



Why is it important?



Youth are in one of, if not the, greatest positions to effect change in the world. They have the greatest connection with their own generations.

It is important to empower youth to purposefully use their talents to serve others and to ensure positive impact of their works throughout their life. We wanted to create opportunity for youth to share their voice and turn ideas into action.

This Years Timeline



1. The contest started January 2026 and ran through late April 2026
 2. The judging happened during the month of June 2026 ,
 3. Results posted July 5th, 2026
- The competition was shared through news, websites, social media and networks.
 - The competition was split into three age groups. Juniors - ages 10-14; Youth - ages 15-18; and Young Adult - ages 19-21
 - All judging was done online, being mindful of schedules, time zones and cultures.

The response was amazing from youth around the world as shown in the following slides.

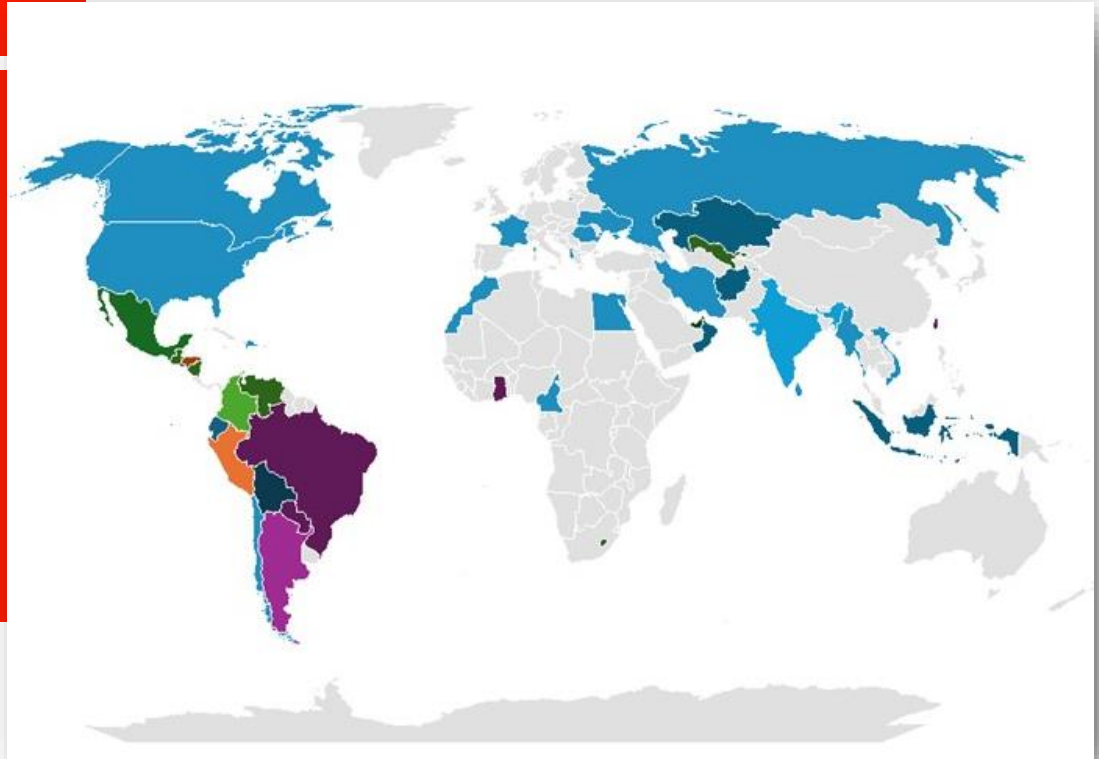

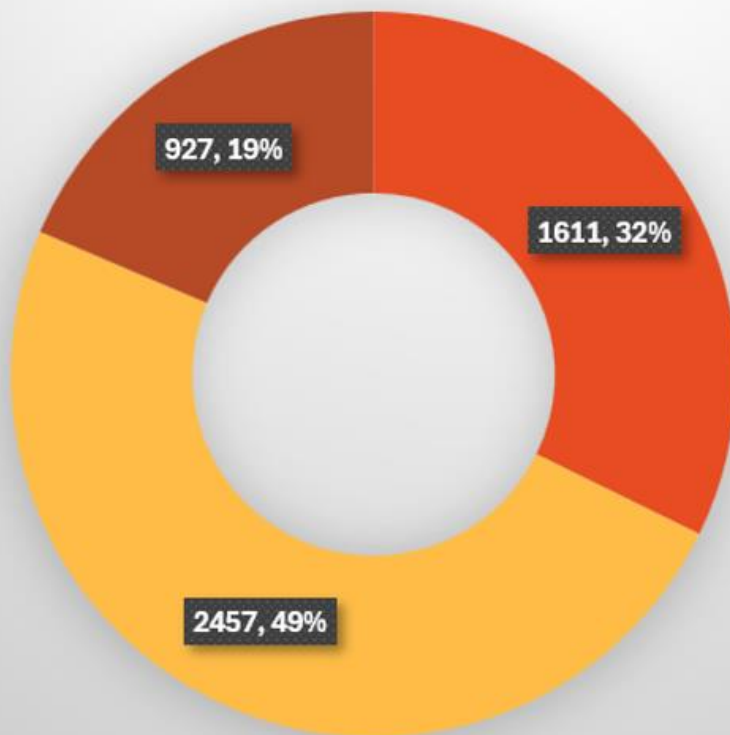

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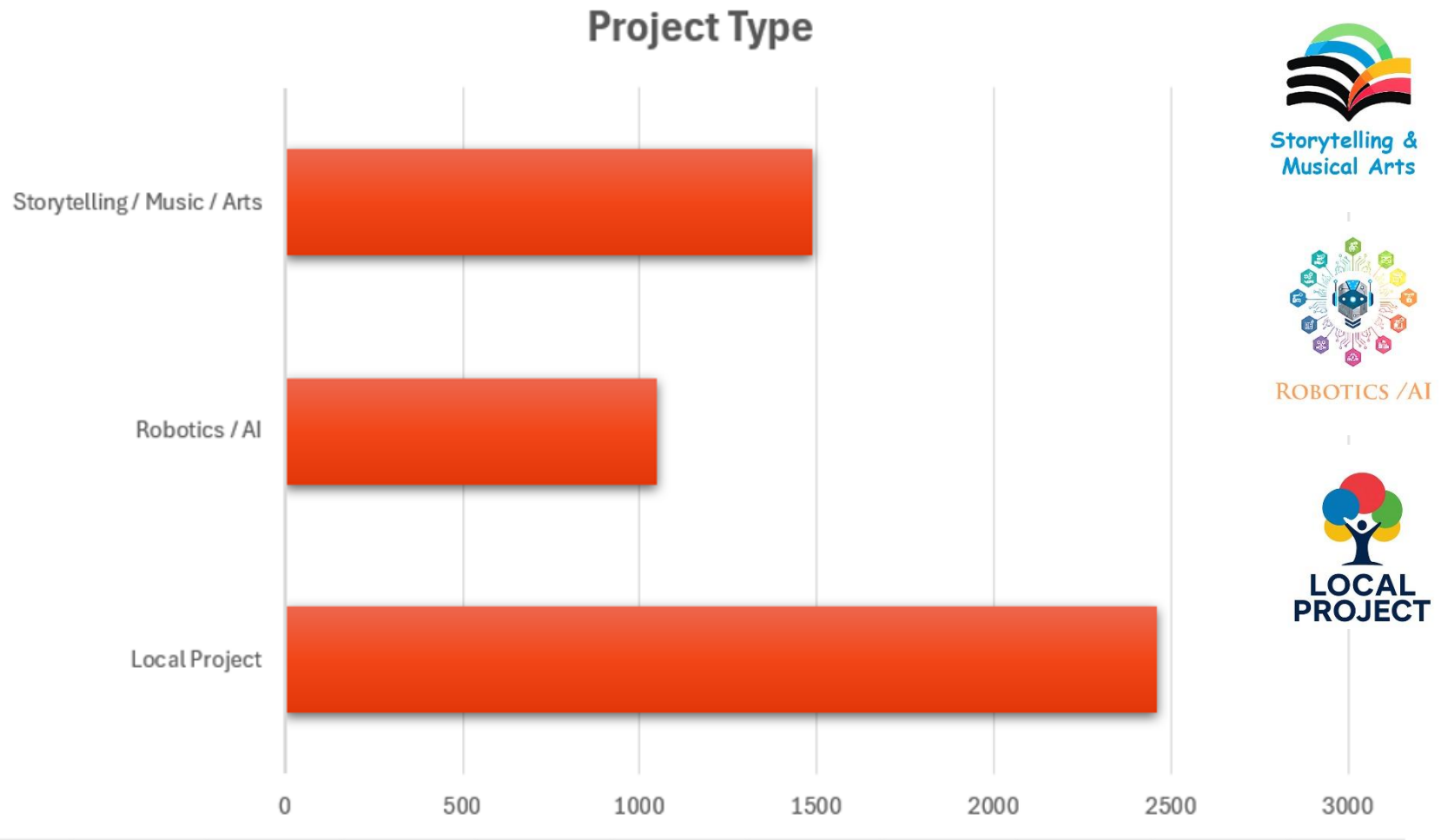
Applications by Age

Participants by Age Group

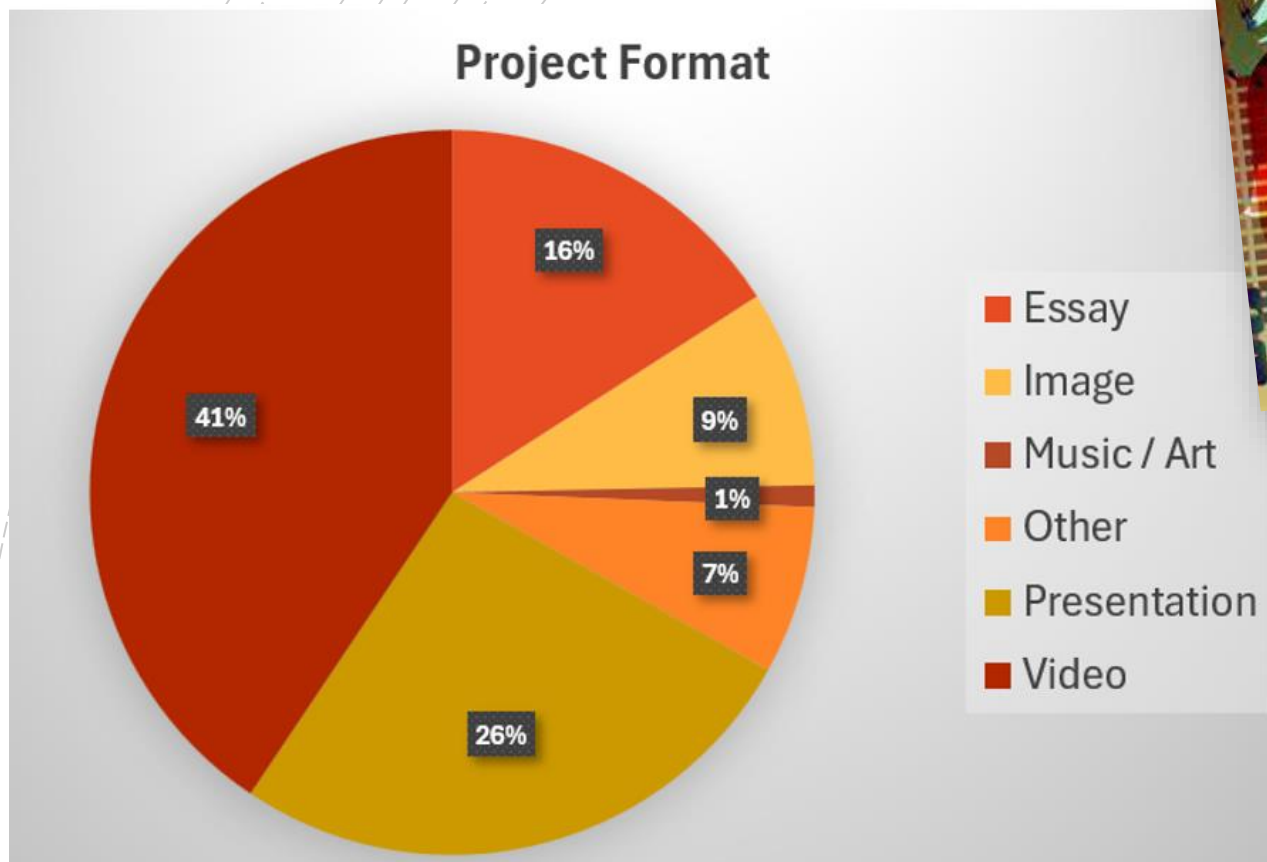

Applications by Project Format

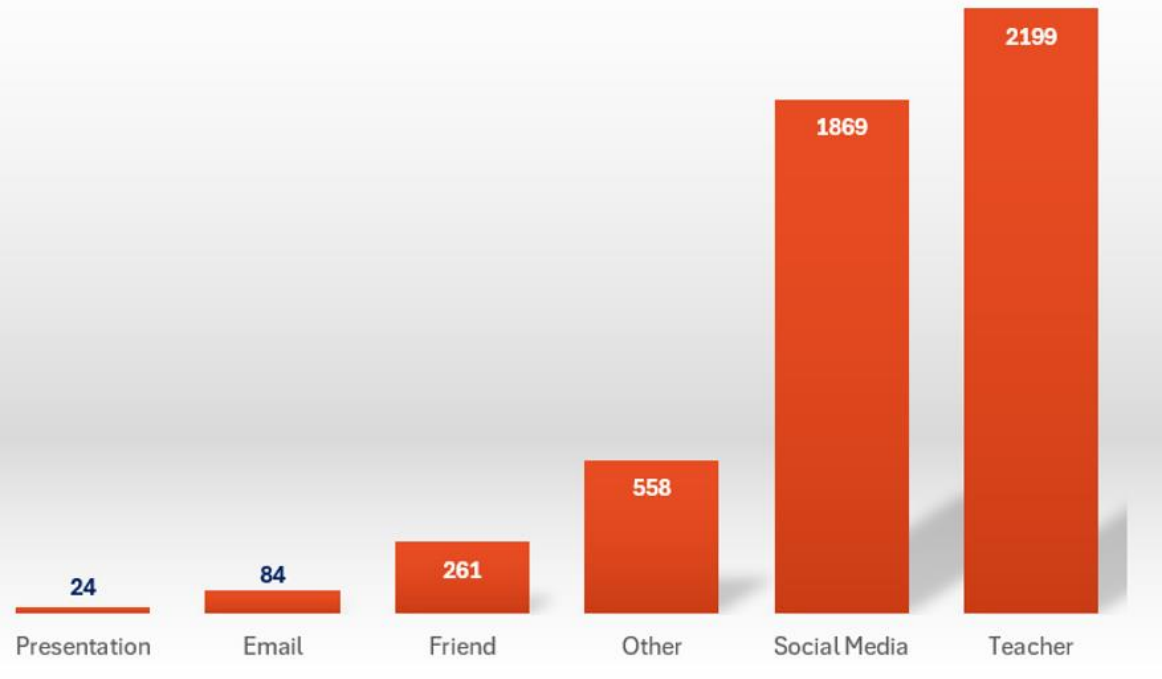
